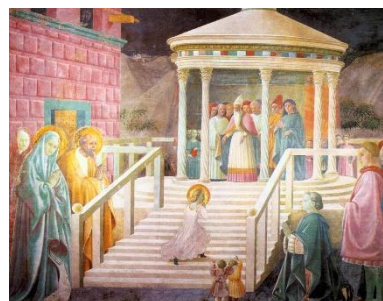


<b>Understand</b>		
By the end of this unit of study, pupils will be able to:		
	Identify some of the people that encounter Jesus and recognise that he is special.	
	Retell, in any form, one of the stories they have heard, recognising these are religious accounts from the Gospel of Luke.	
	Make simple connections between Jesus' announcement of his mission (Lk 4:16-19) and how Christians are called to tell people about God's love today.	
	Ask and answer questions about the story of Zacchaeus and how he changed after meeting Jesus.	



<b>Discern</b>		
By the end of this unit of study, pupils will be able to talk and think creatively and critically about what they have studied, for example, through:		
	Imagining how some of the people who met Jesus felt and how knowing Jesus changed them.	
	Listening to the stories and experiences of how people celebrate Candlemas	
<b>Respond</b>		
During this unit of study, pupils will be invited to respond to their learning, for example by:		
	Reflecting on what the Good News might mean for them.	
	Reflecting on how Jesus is a 'light' for all people, consider how they can bring 'light' to their families and communities. (RVE)	
	Reflecting on how Jesus cares for other people and what they can learn from his actions.
