The Rosary

The Rosary is a prayer to Mary. It consists of 5 decades, each beginning with a short thought about one of the mysteries. In each decade we say 1 Our Father, 10 Hail Marys and 1 Glory Be. We can use the Rosary beads to help counting. There are 4 sets of Mysteries.

- 3. The Nativity (Birth of Jesus).
- 4. The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple.
 - 5. The finding of Jesus in the Temple.

THE LUMINOUS MYSTERIES

- 1. The Baptism of Jesus in the River.
 - 2. The Wedding at Cana.
- 3. The Proclamation of God's Kingdom.
 - 4. The Transfiguration of Jesus.
 - 5. The Institution of the Eucharist.

THE SORROWFUL MYSTERIES

- 1. The Agony in the Garden.
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar.
- 3. The Crowning with Thorns.
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross.
 - 5. The Crucifixion.

THE GLORIOUS MYSTERIES

- 1. The Resurrection of Jesus.
 - 2. The Ascension of Jesus.
- 3. The Coming of the Holy Spirit.
 - 4. The Assumption of Mary.
 - 5. The Crowning of Mary.
